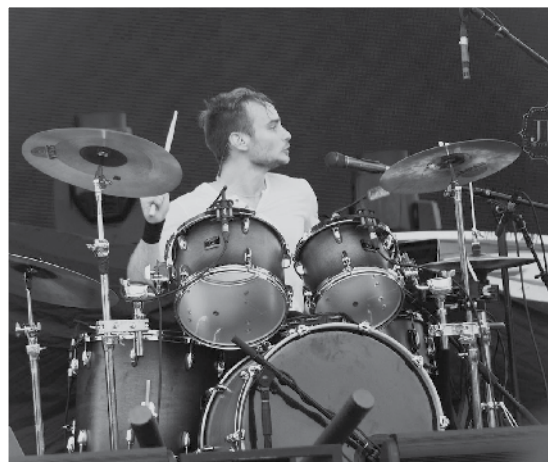
PROGRAM: Health Alliance for Austin Musicians

Going on six years, the Capital Area Dental Foundation has been the official dental provider for the Health Alliance for Austin Musicians (HAAM). CADF dentists serve as the dental home for hundreds of HAAM musicians, providing preventative and restorative care.

Ryan Hannasch, the drummer with the alternative soul band, *Swimming with Bears*, is one of those musicians. After living with dental pain for over a year and not seeing a dentist in over four years, Ryan was connected to the dental office of AnnMarie Olson, DDS, PA and Kacie Culotta, DMD, a board member with the Capital Area Dental Foundation.

Dr. Culotta filled seven of Ryan's cavities and when he lost one of his front teeth, Dr. Culotta introduced him to orthodontist, Dr. Barry Rouch, and oral surgeon, Dr. Dale Gallagher, to develop a treatment plan.

Now that Ryan's teeth are on the mend, he feels more confident smiling and doing interviews. He is also free of dental pain. "It's amazing that through music I have been able to take care of my teeth and get back on track," said Ryan.

Living with painful dental problems is hard enough, but for CADF patient, Deloris Fields, it is even more challenging. The young mother is receiving treatment for breast cancer that has spread to her bones. A series of dental problems, some made worse by her cancer treatments, were not only making it difficult for Deloris to eat and maintain a healthy weight, but they posed a serious risk for infection. “Chemotherapy and radiation make things difficult with your immune system. The last thing I needed was a tooth infection,” explained Deloris.

In 2016, Deloris was connected to CADF dental volunteer, Dr. Kent Macaulay, through the Austin American-Statesman Season for Caring campaign. Dr. Macaulay is a longtime CADF board member and the chairman of the CADF Access to Care committee. He also serves on the board of Breast Cancer Resource Centers, the organization that nominated Deloris for the Season for Caring program.

Over the course of many months, Dr. Macaulay filled eight cavities, built a crown over one tooth and provided a denture to fill the space where one of Deloris's teeth were pulled while she was pregnant with her son and couldn't afford a root canal. Since receiving the dental work, Deloris is not only smiling more, she is enjoying food again. “Food just tastes better now,” she said.

Deloris is deeply grateful that organizations like CADF exist to help people who can't afford dental care. “On my last day with Dr. Macaulay, I took a picture with him and his assistant. It took everything in me not to cry,” she said. “Dr. Macaulay didn't just dedicate his time or his services to me, he dedicated a part of himself.”

PROGRAM: Healthy Smiles for Texans

Four days a week, Sandra Plummer drives 100 miles roundtrip to Austin from her home in Red Rock, Texas to take care of her two young grandchildren. Without the support of the Capital Area Dental Foundation, Sandra would simply not have the energy and good health to make this journey.

In 2016, Sandra received upper and lower dentures as a patient with the Healthy Smiles for Texans program. The 70-year grandmother who lives on her social security benefits applied for the charitable care program in 2015 and was connected with longtime CADF dental volunteer, Dr. Wayne Radwanski.

“Dr. Radwanski did a fantastic job,” she said. “I got incredibly good care. My life and health have been saved by this experience.”

For years, Sandra suffered with mouth pain caused by failing dentures. “When you can’t chew your food properly, it really affects your general health. I was having a lot of health problems that were directly and indirectly related to dental problems,” Sandra said.

Sandra received care at no charge through the Healthy Smiles for Texans program, formerly called the Donated Dental Services program. CADF operates the program in partnership with the TDA Smiles Foundation. In addition to Dr. Radwanski and his team, Sandra received care from Dr. Yankelson, a prosthodontist who helped with the fit of her lower dentures.

When Sandra is not in Austin caring for her grandchildren, she is a regular volunteer at the Food Pantry in Smithville and the one in her hometown of Red Rock. She is deeply appreciative for CADF and the volunteer dentists who changed her life: “I was treated with such kindness and respect and will always be grateful for that.”

Omar was connected to Dr. Timothy Wellik through CADF’s partnership with the St. Vincent de Paul emergency dental care program. Each year, CADF volunteers provide charitable dental care to many families in need throughout the Austin area.

“Omar was such a pleasant man and was so appreciative of what we did for him,” recalled Dr. Wellik. “After his first visit, his wife brought the office a giant feast of homemade food for lunch.”

Over the course of several visits, Dr. Wellik worked on seven of Omar’s teeth—performing two root canals, filling several cavities and cleaning his teeth. Prior to receiving care, Omar had serious tooth decay and was struggling to chew food.

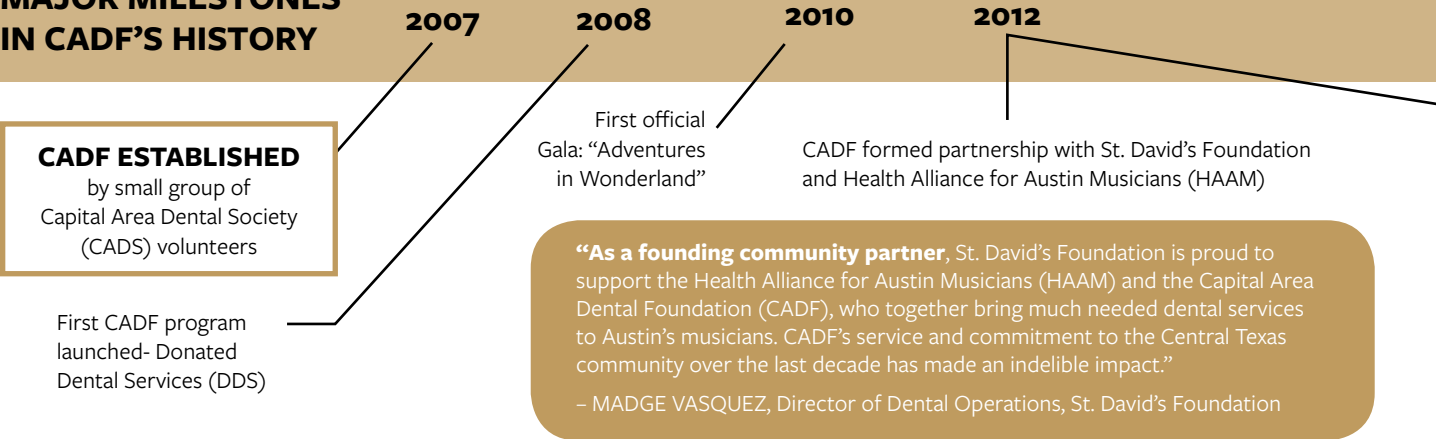

PROGRAM	PATIENTS SERVED	DENTAL SERVICES PROVIDED
Healthy Smiles for Texans	Seniors (62+), disabled, veterans ineligible for Veterans Administration dental benefits and victims of domestic violence.	Comprehensive dental care. Providers work with patient from start to finish.
Health Alliance for Austin Musicians (HAAM)	Uninsured, low-income Austin working musicians.	Exams, cleanings, fillings, most extractions and restorative care. Cosmetic care is not covered. Providers become the musicians' dental home.
HeartGift Foundation	Children who travel to Austin from developing nations to receive lifesaving heart surgery.	Dental care needed to prepare the child for a safe and successful heart surgery.
St. Vincent de Paul	Working poor adults in Central Texas.	Emergency dental care that addresses the source of patient's pain.
Season For Caring	Austin-area families with financial need nominated by local nonprofit organizations and selected by the <i>Austin American-Statesman</i> .	Immediate dental needs of the patient, sometimes including orthodontic work.
